FRENCH "ANARCHIST BRIGADE" MAKES ANOTHER HAUL.

MAY-DAY ATTEMPT PLANNED

Reds Bringing Explosives Into Paris Are Arrested—One Faints When Package Is Dropped But Fails to Explode—Of International Group.

Associated Press Special Cable. Paris, April 26.—The police yesterday made an important capture of Anarchists at Maisons-Alfort, three men named Kuhn, Roussel and Roux being arrested with large quantities of explosives in their possession.

As the package fell, Roussel, who suffered from a heart complaint, turned deathly pale and fainted. A doctor had to be summoned to revive him.

ALFONSO DIRECTS EFFORTS ESPECIALLY TOWARD NAVY.

Associated Press Special Cable. St. Petersburg, April 26.—Count Leo Tolstol is reported by the Russky Viedomosti to have written a characteristic letter regarding the celebrations which are being arranged for his 80th birthday.

FINLAND WORRIES RUSSIA Solution of Problem May be the Annexation of Viborg.

Associated Press Special Cable. St. Petersburg, April 26.—The Finnish crisis continues unabated. Live-ly dissatisfaction has been caused in government circles by the vote of censure which the majority of the Finnish diet passed against the senate for displaying zeal against the Russian revolutionists and by the advice which the senate then offered the governor general that a new senate should be chosen from the parties of the majority.

The imperial government seems disposed to "solve the diet in the hope that new elections will give a majority to the old Finnish as opposed to the Swedish Constitutional party and thus render cordial co-operation possible between the grand duchy and the empire, but if the Socialists again obtain a majority the result will almost certainly culminate in the withdrawal of the province of Viborg from the grand duchy and its annexation to the Russian empire.

IZZET PASHA A PRISONER Turkish Government Dislikes His Criticism of Army.

Associated Press Special Cable. Constantinople, April 26.—Much comment has been caused by the extraordinary treatment of Izzet Pasha, formerly Turkish minister at Madrid. He was recalled and appointed Inspector of the third artillery corps at Monastir. When he arrived on Saturday he went to the Pera Palace hotel, which has since been surrounded by spies and police, who prevent him from leaving the hotel.

BRAZILIAN SERGEANT KILLS FRENCH ARMY INSTRUCTOR. Rio Janeiro, April 26.—Sergeant Mell of the police force at Sao Paulo has been sentenced to twenty years' imprisonment for killing Lieutenant Colonel Negret, a French military instructor who was in the employ of the state. Sergeant Mell shot the French officer on June 12 last, during a drill at Sao Paulo. He fired several shots at Lieutenant Colonel Negret, one of which also killed a Brazilian lieutenant who had tried to protect the Frenchman.

PRINCE HELLE AND MME. GOULD VISIT VESUVIUS.

Naples, April 26.—Prince Helle de Sagan and Mme. Gould and her children went by motor car to Boscoe Terrace on the southern declivity of Mount Vesuvius. They walked through the lava streams of the last eruption to the ruins of Ottino and later played tennis in the hotel garden.

ALFONSO DIRECTS EFFORTS ESPECIALLY TOWARD NAVY.

IS REPAIRING LA GRANJA

Palace Is Being Modernized and Is to Be One of the Prettiest Resorts for Royalty in Europe—To Visit England During Summer.

Madrid, April 26.—King Alfonso was strongly desirous of attending the Cowes regatta this year, and had already made preparations for doing so, but it is reported that other uncancelable engagements will prevent his majesty from fulfilling his desire. Their majesties and the young prince, however, will go to England this summer, as King Alfonso is engaged to play several polo matches and has promised to be present at other functions.

A trial of the sloops has already been made at Ferrol, with excellent results, and they will be shipped to San Sebastian as soon as possible.

The motor boats underwent a trial last Friday, and in spite of a heavy sea they gave marvelous races. Speed experiments will be further made, and it is quite probable that a motor boat regatta between Biarritz and San Sebastian and Bilbao, will be held under the king's patronage.

King Alfonso has ordered large works of reconstruction to be carried out at La Granja palace and all the private rooms have been re-decorated in the English style by British and Spanish craftsmen, who are making La Granja one of the most beautiful palaces in Europe.
