ANCIENT RITE TO BE REVIVED FOR CENTENNIAL.

The archbishop of Mexico, Mons. Jose Mora y del Rio, has decreed that the old custom, long since fallen into disuse, of swearing allegiance to the patroness of Mexico, the Virgin of Guadalupe, shall be revived October 9, in celebration of the centennial and that on that date the ceremony he held in all the Catholic churches. The ceremony is very interesting, yet very peculiar. It consists in placing an image of the Savior on the altar between two lighted wax candles. At the base of the image are placed images of the apostles, and worshippers pass one by one laying their hands upon the heads of the images of the apostles and repeating at the same time the act of consecration. As it is estimated that thousands |


