

Members of the party accompanying President Madero on his visit to he power plant of the Mexico Light and Power company when seen yesterday in their expressions of admiration for the immensity of the undertaking and of appreciation of the hespitality dispensed by the company through its general manager, Harro

Harrsen, who accompanied the party. The party was formed of about sixity persons, including the president, Ernesto Madero, minister of finance; Manuel Benilla, minister of communications; Pedro Lascurain, minister of foreign relations, the British, Russian, Italian and German ministers and many other persons prominent in diplomatic and political circles.

A train conveying 200 soldiers preceded the presidential special train. | which was followed by one containing? a force of rurales. Every town along the line of route was gaity decorated and the inhabitants turned out en masse to greet the party.

The entire day on Sunday was spent inspecting the dams and power stations, the president personally showing the greatest interest in everything. 
